

Town of Bartlett Office of Selectmen

Meeting Minutes: June 18, 2010

Attendance: Chairman Gene Chandler, Douglas Garland, Jon Tanguay

Reporters: None

Meeting opened at 08:35 AM.

Ed O'Neil (1INTPK-WAS-XXA,B,C,D, and E) had submitted a building permit and stopped in to see if the Selectmen had had a chance to review his application. Chairman Chandler explained that they hadn't had an opportunity to review it yet as it will take a little while. Selectman Garland stated that he had a question as knowing how sensitive working in this area has been in the past and to prevent further issues would O'Neil have a problem if the Conservation Commission looked at the property to be sure that no work was being done in the wetlands. O'Neil replied that he had no problem with the Conservation Commission going to the property and checking it out. They are not planning on starting work until this fall. Chairman Chandler inquired if they would be putting decks or porches on the buildings. O'Neil replied no that they might possibly put a patio on but that would be it. Chairman Chandler reminded him that decks have to meet setback requirements. O'Neil stated that they are planning on keeping within the footprints on the plans.

Annette Libby, Bartlett Recreation Director, is having a few issues with the Cal Ripken league as it is consuming a lot of her time as she is doing the fund raisers, scheduling, and when there is a problem the coaches are hollering at her and she has no say when there is an issue. Chairman Chandler inquired as to how many teams Bartlett has. Libby replied that this year we have three teams. Chairman Chandler would like to see a meeting held before next year as he would like to see us continue on with the league and explain to them that they need to do fund raisers and have the coaches sign a form the same way the Bartlett coaches do. Selectman Garland would like to see the coaches sign on with our sportsmanship and morals. Selectman Tanguay inquired what part Kyler Drew plays in this. Libby explained that he is the Bartlett representative on the Cal Ripken board. Libby stated that we are considered a sponsor and that we collect \$40.00 from each child and \$20.00 of it goes to Conway to cover equipment costs, etc. It was agreed that Libby would draft up something that includes having more say over discipline issues. Chairman Chandler inquired what was

going on with the Haley uniforms. Libby replied that they have been ordered and that there was an issue with the banner. Libby stated that Mary Ann Orsino was to order the banner but had problems getting the logo from the Haley's as she had wanted the banner to look professional. Chairman Chandler inquired as to why they just didn't order the banner that was wanted. Libby replied because they didn't get the logo to us. Libby also mentioned that in April she had sent out forms for parents to sign their children up for summer camp and that they needed to get the form back to her as soon as possible but that the money didn't have to be in until June 18th. The week she was on vacation she had received forms and money from the Haley's to sign their children up. She had her assistant stamp the date and time received on applications received that week in case she had to put people on a waiting list it would be a first come first serve basis as she can only enroll 58 children as that is what the bus holds. The Haley's forms came in on June 11th and they were put on a waiting list. Chairman Chandler stated that if the money was in on the 11th and the deadline was the 18th the Haley's had their paperwork in before the deadline, per what was written on the website that they should be allowed into the program. Libby stated that the website was a mistake. Selectman Garland inquired as to what are the odds of getting in if you are on a waiting list. Libby stated that the Haley's are 3rd and 4th on the list and all this could be resolved by Monday. Chairman Chandler stated that if you sign up by the week stated and send your check with the form you should get in. Selectman Garland stated this is a very uncomfortable situation. Libby stated that this is the way she has been doing it for four years and this hasn't been a problem before and she is not changing the way she is doing it. The Selectmen informed Libby that she needs to correct her forms and be sure that it states on them that she takes the first 58 children that have sent in forms and money. The Selectmen also inquired about the scholarship funds. Libby stated that so far she hasn't received the Joe Rivers funds this year, however, everyone is getting something.

Chairman Chandler made a motion at 10:10 AM to enter nonpublic session to discuss a request for aid under NH RSA 91-A: 3 II (c). Selectman Garland seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Chairman Chandler made a motion at 10:25 AM to end the nonpublic session and to seal the minutes. Selectman Tanguay seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

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The Selectmen received a telephone call from Police Chief Timothy Connifey as he has an officer on the force who is resigning and he needs to hire someone for at least part time. The Selectmen will discuss this further when more details become available but it is ok to look for a part time officer. Connifey also informed the Selectmen that the Crown Vic cruiser is leaking oil and the lights on the Impala aren’t working. Connifey will have Tim’s garage look at the oil leak and he will take the other cruiser to Lily Pond to get the lights repaired. Connifey also mentioned that he needs two to three batteries for the portables and the cost is \$100.00 each. Selectman Tanguay suggested that he check at the fire station as they have a machine to recondition batteries which will extend the life of the ones he has now. The Selectmen agreed that he should purchase one new battery and check with the fire chief about reconditioning the other ones.

Chairman Chandler made a motion to appeal the Zoning Board of Adjustments decision on case # 2010-01 for River Run Company at Rogers Crossing (3RT302-176R01). Selectman Garland seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Chandler had a prior commitment and left the meeting at 10:55 AM.

The Selectmen attempted to place a call to the town’s attorney, but he was unavailable to speak to.

The Selectmen reviewed correspondence, building permits, signed letters and checks prior to and throughout the meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 11:25 AM.
