

Town of Bartlett Office of Selectmen

Meeting Minutes: June 25, 2010

Attendance: Chairman Gene Chandler, Douglas Garland, Jon Tanguay

Meeting opened at 08:30 AM.

Ed O'Neil (1INTPK-WAS-XXA,B,C,D,E) met with the Selectmen in reference to his building permit application. He had submitted the required additional information that was requested at last weeks meeting. Chairman Chandler stated that the Selectmen had signed the permit and after it was processed it would be mailed to him. O'Neil mentioned that he doesn't have a problem if the Conservation Commission wants to do a walk of the property. Selectman Garland reminded him that he doesn't have to do that if he doesn't want to, however, with no pictures to view there may be an issue with one driveway. O'Neil replied that a couple of the driveways for the lots may be tight. Selectman Garland also mentioned that some of the heights vary on the plan. O'Neil stated that they will all be below the requirements. O'Neil left his cell phone number for the Conservation Commission so they could contact him.

Chairman Chandler mentioned that Dick Glines of the Lower Bartlett Water Precinct informed him that they are looking for property to have a back up well on and the property they are looking at is behind Believe in Books (1RT016-201-L10), which is owned by the Town. Selectman Garland suggested they put their request in writing.

Chairman Chandler stated that he would be unavailable to meet on July 2nd. The Selectmen decided to move the July 2nd meeting to Thursday, July 1st.

Selectman Garland made a motion at 10:00 AM to enter nonpublic session to discuss a personnel issue with Police Chief Timothy Connifey. Selectman Tanguay seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Selectman Garland made a motion at 10:30 AM to end the nonpublic session and to seal the minutes. Chairman Chandler seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Police Chief Timothy Connifey informed the Selectmen that the 2000 Crown Vic cruiser had a problem with the heater core leaking antifreeze. This has been temporarily repaired. He is in hopes of receiving the new cruiser within two weeks and being able to park this vehicle. He is also having the 2001 Impala lights worked on and will be taking the car to Lily Pond this week. Connifey also informed the Selectmen that the ATV grant that he had applied for was denied. He will retry next year.
