

TOWN OF BARTLETT – OFFICE OF THE SELECTMEN
MINUTES – SELECTMEN’S MEETING - FRIDAY, OCTOBER 3, 2008

Meeting opened at 8:30AM.

Admin. Asst. Lynn Jones went over the interrogatories with the Selectmen concerning the Red River/ Mark Dryjas lawsuit.

Motion was made by Garland, seconded by Tanguay to enter Non Public Session under NH RSA 91-A:3 II (c) to interview a request for aid. Vote = unanimous to enter NPS at 9:00AM. The Selectmen interviewed the applicant. Motion was made by Tanguay, seconded by Garland to end NPS. Vote = unanimous to end NPS at 9:15AM.

Motion was made by Garland, seconded by Tanguay to enter Non Public Session under NH RSA 91-A:3 II(c) to interview a request for aid. Vote = unanimous to enter NPS at 9:20AM. The Selectmen interviewed the applicant. Motion was made by Tanguay, seconded by Garland to end NPS. Vote = unanimous to end NPS at 9:35AM.

Motion was made by Garland, seconded by Tanguay to enter Non Public Session under NH RSA 91-A:3 II(c) to interview a request for aid. Vote = unanimous to enter NPS at 9:40AM. The Selectmen interviewed the applicant. Motion was made by Tanguay, seconded by Garland to end NPS. Vote = unanimous to end NPS at 9:55AM.

William Duggan stopped in stating he was in the process of purchasing the Michael Gaudette property at 690 West Side Road (6WSTSD-80L03) and was wondering what the town’s position was regarding the vehicles parked across the street on the Sue Gaudette property that apparently belong to Michael Gaudette. Garland indicated that we had received a complaint from another abutter, we had asked the police dept. to review the matter and contact the State due to possible issues of the vehicles parked in the right-of-way and unregistered vehicles. Duggan stated that people were living there. Chandler stated that people cannot live there and we don’t have any concrete evidence that people are living there. Duggan feels the property is becoming a junk yard and wants to know what the town is going to do about it. Garland stated that we can’t enforce regulations we don’t have and there is nothing that we can do except if someone is actually living there. Chandler wrote a memo to the Police Chief asking if he had heard from the State or what the status of the property was concerning people living there.

Selectmen reviewed correspondence and building permits and signed checks throughout the meeting.

Motion was made by Tanguay, seconded by Garland to adjourn. Vote = meeting adjourned at 10:45AM.
